AT THE PROJECT

How we work

A day at Oye LENA starts with a short meeting with all the volunteers. In the morning we work one-on-one with the children with disabilities. Every child with a disability follows his individual schedule, adapted to his or her needs. In the afternoon we pick up the toddlers and other children with a disability. When they arrive at Oye LENA they receive a hot meal. With development goals we set up ourselves, we try to stimulate the children through various activities. Every day the children follow a class and after that they can choose out of different learning centers where they want to play. We also organize a lot of special activities. You can read more about this in what follows!

Special events

Goodbye Mayra, welcome Cristhel and welcome back Brandon!

Mayra, our Peruvian teacher and chauffeur decided to leave Oye LENA after 4 months because her own company, which organizes events, was growing and it became difficult to combine the two jobs. We said goodbye to her with all the children with a big party and a lot of hugs. Luckily our previous driver Brandon decided to come back and his girlfriend Cristhel Rosario joined our team as well. Christel will mostly work with the special children and the children from primary school until she goes back to school to study.



Virtual lessons with Apple employees: 2 new employees!

In the last newsletter you could read that Oye LENA started with a new way of volunteerwork: virtual lessons with Apple employees from the Apple store in Tacoma. In September we started with drawing classes on the iPad with the App 'Procreate', given by Jonathan Himmelstein. In November Emily Chamberlain also dediced to join and gave music classes with the App 'Guitarband'. Another co-worker of them, Sean now gives guitar lessons through the webcam to the graduated chidren! It's really nice to see how motivated our children are during these classes.



Visit to the dentist

In November we made our annual visit to the dentist with all the children. The last few years we set up appointments for the parents. However, when we followed up on this it turned out that not a lot of parents went back, even though for a lot of kids it was really necessary. That's why this year we decided to follow-up on the appointments and really motivate the parents by paying their dentist bills.

In November, only 5 children had no problems with their teeth and didn't have to go back for 6 months. All the other children had to go back 2 weeks later or almost immidiatly. Some kids even had to go back multiple times. A lot of teeth had to be pulled out.



Now that Oye LENA has started following up on the appointments and has started paying backthe bills, things have drastically improved. We have payed back 40 appointments and now 30 children have healthy teeth and only have to come back in 6 months. Good news!



Marleni

As you could read in previous newsletters, Marleni had an operation about half a year ago in the hospital Diospy Suyana. Her leg was never fully healed after an accident she had when she was 2 years old.

Since the operation we do a monthly check-up with the traumatologist. On the last X-ray they noticed that one of the metal pins in her leg is broken and her leg still hasn't healed as it should heal. De doctors thought that the cause of this might be malnourishment so we will pay extra attention to her diet and she will get extra vitamins. In March she has a new appointment. If a new metal pin breaks by then, she will need surgery again. We will keep you posted!

We won a PRESTIGIOUS PRICE of CURAHUASI: Anís de Oro.

Every year around the 24th of November all the people of Curahuasi come together for a big party! The whole week there are a lot of activities like dance competitions, parades, foodstands on the main square, a downhill competition, horseriding and many more.

This year Oye LENA won the prestigious price from the municipality: the Anís de Oro! A price given to some projects, companies, restaurants,.. for their achievements. Projectfounder Stefanie Van Erps was invited to personally receive the price. We're really happy with this honor and acknowledgement.



FELIZ NAVIDAD!

On the last Friday of 2019 we celebrated Christmas with all the children and their parents. There where different activities the parents could do, such as throwing Christmas balls to a live Christmas tree, passing a gift around without using their hands, shaving Santa's beard, going to the photobooth and much more! Parents earned coins for every completed activity, with which they could choose something from the gifttabel (clothes, toys, hats,...). Oye LENA also gave all the children a present: the girls got clothes to dress-up and the boys got a ball and writing utensils. We ended the afternoon with Panetón (a typical cake) and hot chocolate milk.

Both the parents and their children really enjoyed the party.



Theme based working

At Oye LENA, we use monthly themes in our work with our special kids, our toddlers, as well as the project and the classes in the mountain schools. Every month we pick a new theme, which will then become the common theme throughout all the lessons and classes. These themes are fixed for three school years. Every theme is linked with (Peruvian/Belgian) objectives. Cognitive goals are important, but also social and emotional well-being, as well as attitudes. In every theme, we incorporate methods like 'Sherborne' (Development Movement), 'Snoezelen' (Controlled Multisensory Environment), learning centres, Multisensory Storytelling, yoga, writing dance,...

Our education starts from the children's living environment consisting of challenges and experiences, calling for experimenting and exploring. This forms a basis for motivated learning. Through 'playful learning' and 'learning by doing', we try to stimulate the development of the children to increase thier chances of a better future.

November theme = the 4 elements

This month we worked around the 4 elements. We did a lot of experiments with water, fire and air, we made paper airplanes, we learned about recycling to protect the environment, we made a volcano and learned how a volcano works. To conclude this month's theme we did a Tik Tak (Belgian program for children) and a shadow theatre.

December theme = toys and Christmas

This month we didn't only learn about Christmas, but also about toys. We did this because Christmas isn't celebrated traditionally like we do in Belgium/Europe. The children made their own toys in the creative corner, they did a scavenger hunt for toys, they painted toys,...



Weekly visits to the mountain schools of Ccochua and Puka Puka

Once a week we go to a remote mountain school, alternately in the villages Puka Puka and Ccochua. We give classes to the toddlers there and try to improve the level of education in cooperation with the local teacher. We want to teach them methodologies like Writing Dance, 'Snoezelen' (Controlled Multisensory Environment), 'Sherborne' (Development Movement), Multisensory Storytelling,...

The children in these mountain villages mostly, or exclusively, speak Quechua at home, while classes at school are given in Spanish. In addition, most kids have low-skilled parents who do not always acknowledge the importance of education and do not stimulate the development of their children at home. Due to this, the children have a huge disadvantage compared to their peers.

Ccochua is a 45-minute drive away from the project. Miss Myriam has nine students in her class, aged 3 to 6 years.

Puka Puka is a 20-minute drive away from the project. Miss Pelaya has 5 students in her class, also aged 3 to 6 years. There's also a primary school, apart from the nursery school, where all ages are divided into two groups. The classroom is slightly bigger, but the means of the teacher are still quite limited.

By visiting these schools, we try to support the local teachers and improve the level of education. The volunteers, children, and the teachers already reacted enthusiastic!

In December Stefanie, Sara, Hannah, Lisa and Sofie went to the 'Fiesta de promoción' in Ccocchua. Three children graduated from kindergarten. All the children got a present from us. The next day some volunteers also went to the Christmas party of Ccocchua. They played the game 'musical present' and at the end they also got some presents to play together with in the classroom.



Monthly visit to the hot springs of Cconoc

Once a month we pay a visit to the hot springs of Cconoc, a 20-minute drive away from the project. One month we do this with our toddlers and the other month with our students with different abilities. First, we teach the toddlers to enjoy the water. The ones that feel ready can start doing preparatory exercises for swimming.

Children in Curahuasi rarely, or never, go to a swimming pool, which causes a lot of children to be afraid of the water for the first time. They overcome their fear rather quickly. In the end they cannot wait to jump into the water again!

Volunteer Eline Claessens is a trainer in a swimclub in Belgium. With her knowledge she made a list of exercises to do in the pool of Cconoc. This way the children can get used to the water and eventually learn to swim. It's very useful because we see that a lot of children who are already in primary school can still not swim or are scared of the water.



Bristers' Day

The term 'Bristers' refers to **br**others and **sisters** of our special children. In the past, we noticed that our special kids were not always treated correctly by their siblings. In some cases, we even noticed abuse. In specific, signs of jealousy towards the presents and care they were given at the project. By organizing this day, we want to include the siblings. The objective is to offer them psychological support and to pay attention to their feelings as well. We try to reinforce the relations between the siblings in order to improve the quality of life for both parties this way.

In November we baked pancakes! One of the favorite activities of the 'Bristers'. But before we could start making the pancakes the children had to do different exercices to collect the ingredients for the recipe. In December all the brothers and sisters were also invited to come celebrate at the Christmas party.



Parental participation

Every month, we meet with the parents of our children. While enjoying a snack and a drink, we show them pictures of what we did in the last month.

First of all, we want to keep them updated about the ins and outs at Oye LENA and the evolution of their child. Also, we organize workshops to teach the parents how they can stimulate their children and their development. We talk about education in general, the difficulties that come with this, and the importance of healthy food and health in general. We meet with some of the mothers more frequently. They cooperate in the project 'Mamita Made Materials'. These mums create handmade objects (mittens, scarves, dolls,...), of which the entire profit of the sale goes back to them. More information about this project can be found later in this newsletter, and at the Mamita Made Materials Facebook page

In November we organized a parent meeting in which we informed parents about the agreements with the dentist at the german hospital Diospy Suyana. We provided them with more information about dental hygiene and the importance of brushing your teeth. In December everyone was invited to the Christmas party. On party's like this we organise a lot of activities that parents have to do together with their child. This way they learn to work together and bond more.

Monthly visit to the orphanage of Cachora

In May 2016, we discovered that two of our loyal students, Brayan and Jesús, were abandoned at the orphanage of Cachora, and we decided to pay them a visit. It was heartbreaking and -warming at the same time. By experiencing these mixed emotions, we were compelled to return every month.

The 2 boys barely have contact with their mother and little brother. They merely visit them once or twice a year. It is obvious they still suffer from the situation, but after a long period of domestic violence and abuse, we hope they will get more stability in their lives and a better future.

To contribute to this, we go visit them one Saturday or Sunday a month. We organize activities, catch up, eat, and drink something tasty. The focus is on entertainment and joy. We want to offer the kids a day to look forward to every month. Every month it's a very nice day that goes by way too fast!

In December, just like every year, we went to the orphanage with all the volunteers to celebrate Christmas with the children. We played games, they got presents and we ate Panetón together!



Graduated children

Every Friday afternoon and during the holidays, the children who graduated from Oye LENA over the past few years still come to the project. De oldest child is already 10 years old now! They follow their own program, separate from the toddlers, and get lessons adjusted to their own level within different development domains.

While we still give study guidance to the graduated children, we also do a lot of other things! We learned to play the 'cupsong', we played games about social skills, we made Christmas cards, learned to sing 'We wish you a Merry Christmas' and played a lot of playground games.



Oye Mundo

Oye LENA works with volunteers: people from all over the world who come and help on the project. Our volunteers are our key figures; thanks to them we can achieve our goals every day, for and with the children.

Every month we normally organize a workshop for the volunteers but these two months two volunteers took this assignment upon themselves and organized an activity related to their internship or thesis. Floor Somers gave a PowerPoint about **volunteerism** and informed us about the pro's and con's of volunteerwork. Luckily we could conclude that we as a project already think about these issues and work around them. Lore Moermans organized a workshop about **working with music with children who have a disability**. She explained the pro's and after that the volunteers could experience the benefits of music in practice by participating in some musical activities.



Volunteers come and go

The number of volunteers varies throughout the year, but 3/4 of the year we can count on 10 volunteers. Some volunteers stay for 4 weeks, whilst others stay for a year. But every visit and contribution is much appreciated.

Unfortunatly we had to say goodbye to a lot of volunteers in December. Occupational therapists Fien de Groef and Lien Hofmans were amazing with the special children. Fien worked a lot with Maria and they were like two peas in a pod! Lien, always enthousiastic and happy, worked a lot with Diana and Lucho.

Besides them we also had a lot of students: Sofie Debrabandere and Helena Craye, students occupational therapy from the school HOGENT; Sofie worked out a lot of lessons about sexual education and tried new things with Jhoel. Helena worked a lot with Lucho and Reyson. With Reyson she worked out a project around social skills.

Lore Moerans and Brenda Elbrink, student primary teacher from the school UCLL Hasselt: Both prepared classes for the graduated children. Lore also worked a lot around music and Brenda gave inidivual classes to some toddlers, like Josue and Asiri, children who normally follow the other classes in their group but benefit from differentiation.

Thank you guys for all your help! We will miss you enthousiasm and won't forget your hard work!

Mamita Made Materials: a knitting project for and by our mothers

Mamita Made Materials is a project we started in January 2017. The intention of this side project is to help the mothers of the pupils by giving them a decent wage in exchange for knitting or crocheting of different materials.

Over and over again, many mothers quite desperately asked for a job or financial help. At first, we didn't know how exactly to help these moms. In the past, we proposed that they knit or crochet hats, scarves, sweaters, etc., but surprisingly nobody reacted positively. Later on, we discovered why: no one had the financial means to buy the necessary wool. So... we decided to provide the wool ourselves.

From now on, we supply a few spheres of wool to the mothers who wish to participle in the project. They are also able to consult some specialized knitting magazines as an inspiration source. In exchange for a knitted or crocheted item, they obtain a fair fee. Part of the profit goes to the mothers, and the other part to Oye LENA for the purchase of new wool.

Zonta Club Roeselare made it possible for us to realize this project. They donated a starting capital of 2000 Euros, so we could purchase the wool, the crocket hooks, the knitting needles, the magazine copies, etc.

Our tote bags are a big success! We already sold 100 tote bags and 30 more clients are waiting for their order. (5)

BECOME A GODPARENT

Oye LENA has 2 new godparents:

OYE LENA IS ALWAYS LOOKING FOR MORE GODPARENTS!

You can offer a whole new future to a child for only a couple of eurocents a day.

When you become a godparent, you first receive <u>a picture</u> via e-mail. Godparents who are active on facebook are mentioned in the pictures we post of their child.

Most <u>communication</u> will happen via e-mail, in order to keep the costs down. Twice a year you will receive mail of your godchild. If you do not feel like sending your godchild messages, that's no problem at all.

If you do feel like sending something, you can do so in English, and we will make sure to translate in Spanish. Keep in mind that the children are very young still. They will appreciate a nice picture more than a long letter. Do not forget that it can take a while before your letters arrive in Peru. If you want to avoid long waiting times, it is also possible to send an e-mail. We will make sure your e-mail gets printed and handed over to the child.

It is also possible for you to come and visit the project and your godchild. Just let us know in advance!

In order to make sure <u>payments</u> arrive smoothly, it is best to use a standing order. This way, you automatically deposit a monthly fixed amount into our bank account (a minimum of 10 Euro per month = 0.30 Euro a day).

The money is not specifically destined to your individual godchild, but will be used for every child on the project. It will also be used to:

- buy food and drinks. The children receive a free lunch, fruit, a snack and drinks every day.
- finance visits to the doctor, where the children receive free treatment and medication.
- buy toys and educational materials.
- celebrate birthdays and other festivities (cake and presents!).
- pay the wages of our Peruvian cook and teachers.

Of course, we will keep you up to date about the latest developments of the project and your godchild!

TAX CERTIFICATE? Yes, that's possible!

Did you know that you can receive a tax certificate for your donations from 40 Euro onwards? This certificate can be added to your tax declaration and the amount of your donation will be deducted from your taxable income.

To determine if you are entitled to a tax certificate for a certain assessment year, all donations you gave during that year are summed up at the beginning of the next assessment year. If you reach a sum of 40 Euro or more, you receive a tax certificate. You receive this at the beginning of the year following the year in which you made the donation.

The certificate will only be given for donations to the account number of LZG:
